## ARABIC 316-2 CLASSIC ARABIC TEXTS: ONE THOUSAND AND ONE NIGHTS

This course emphasizes the analysis of the use and function of Arabic in its literary context as presented by the stories in The Thousand and One Nights, also called The Arabian Nights. Each story is supported by comprehension, and vocabulary- and grammar-building exercises. In-class discussions will reinforce the use of new vocabulary and grammatical function, as well as enhance the understanding and appreciation of different layers of Arab culture and history with a focus on perception of women in the narrative and social justice issues.
